Dear Friends and Supporters of the DeKoven Center,

Behind the quiet exterior, this beautiful, sacred, and historic facility has been extremely busy in 2022; This has been a year that we have invested in the future, improved the facilities, increased the safety and security, and upgraded the food/ beverage service departments. These improvements have expanded the capacity

of our kitchens and facilities, setting us up for a better 2023 and allowing us to qualify for a 3-yr. federal grant that underwrote our ambitious community service projects and aided in our financial stability

We are blessed to have a diversity of income sources. It is our expectation that each department/entity on campus generate revenues that contribute to our overall financial stability. The DeKoven Center has become a preferred destination for weddings and community events, our gym is home to 12 local youth groups, and we have 12 residential, 5 commercial and 2 Airbnb's rental units on campus. The Archives Department is expanding to include religious orders throughout the country. Unfortunately, the Retreat Center business itself has been the slowest entity to return to pre-pandemic levels, but we feel very fortunate that we have made it through these times when many retreat and conference centers have closed permanently, as the Covid-crisis impacted business for years longer than anyone could have predicted.

The financial report shows that grants are up this year, but donations and bequests are down compared to previous years. We are hopeful donations and bequests will return in 2023.

We clearly understand the cost of providing a place where history, religion, and architecture intersect to create a sacred space for quiet contemplation, joyous celebrations and more. We believe the DeKoven

Center creates a more loving and compassionate world for all who visit and remain committed to that vision. We appreciate your generosity, your partnership, and your friendship.
